## General Tips

Here are a few things to consider when having to justify both the travel and conference expense:

### Benefits of the Conference:

- You will be bringing back lots of new strategies to share with other teachers, students and parents.
- You can share all the materials you receive from the conference with your colleagues in your school. (You always receive great handouts and resources from every session you attend)
- Sessions cover important and relevant topics to teachers of all streams, grades and languages.
- By attending the conference, you will have the opportunity to speak with many members from our industry, both OMLTA/AOPLV members and community partners that provide new, innovative language products, materials, and equipment that you would be able to test out and introduce to your school and your colleagues.

### Before you go:

- If possible, have your lesson plans ready and show who will be covering your classes for you while you are attending the conference.
- Offer to share a room to reduce the hotel expenses. You can find a roommate through the French Teachers Facebook page or other social media connections.
- Make note of the Early Bird Registration deadlines (**February 16th, 2018**) to get the lowest rate to attend the conference.
- Your OMLTA/AOPLV and CASLT membership allows for a reduced conference rate, thereby continuing your professional learning all year long (great to include in your ALP)
- Offer to present and deliver an after-school Professional Development session to your colleagues in the school to share the information you learned.
